#### **Media and Other Activities:**

**8/8** – Creative Loafing printed an article on Amendment 2. Melissa Zepeda and Myriam Parham were both interviewed for the C.L. article. We discussed the reasons to vote "No to 2" on the Florida Nov 5 ballot. This amendment was very misleading. It said to vote for Fishing and Hunting rights, which people already have. The ramifications of this amendment becoming law is that just about any protection that fish and wildlife may now have to protect them could be jeopardized in the name of the "right" for the hunters or fishermen. To learn more about this amendment please go to *Noto2.org*. According to the website, Amendment 2 is a threat to wildlife, marine populations and private property rights.

10/2 - Melissa Zepeda interviewed by Duncan Strauss on the WMNF Talking Animals program regarding why ALL should've voted No on Amendment 2, regarding a Constitutional Right to Hunt and Fish. Existing laws allow fishing & hunting, that offer at least some protections for the wildlife. Sadly, the passage of Amendment 2 now poses a huge threat to reasonable protections. Let's not forget to help the voiceless when we have an opportunity.

#### **Quote from World Animal Protection:**

"This dangerous and misleading amendment will strip Florida citizens of their power to protect and conserve wild animals. It's designed to trick voters into allowing some of the cruelest forms of hunting and prevent citizens, scientists, and agencies from protecting wildlife in the future. World Animal Protection says a resounding "no" to Amendment 2."

7/28 & 8/9 - Emergency Protests Against Illegal & Cruel Horse Slaughter for Meat - In response to **Animal Recovery Mission's** (**ARM**) recent investigation at an illegal slaughter farm in Brooksville (where retired racehorse "**Funny Biz**" was video recorded being shot, stabbed to death, and then butchered), FVA joined ARM & Solutionary Species for an Emergency Protest to ask for justice for the cruel killing of Funny Biz. A group of about 25 activists joined some local folks to call for the arrest and conviction of those involved in this horrific killing.

8/2, 8/3 & 8/4 - Loomis Brothers Circus Protests at Sarasota Fairgrounds-Robarts Arena – organized by Laura Weiss

8/24 & 8/25 - Sign waving events to save our Honeymoon Island state park from development. #### Petco's Troubling History with Rabbit

Despite PETCO'S "2008 promise and philosophy to do the right thing", the company has broken that promise. PETCO will be purchasing "Teddy Bear Teacup and Miniature Rabbits" (Dwarf rabbits) from breeders to sell in several of their stores. By doing so, PETCO is responsible for promoting unhealthy rabbit breeding. As cute as they may look, please refrain from purchasing Teddy Bear rabbits for ethical reasons, because these little rabbits have a problematic breeding history. Dwarf rabbits that are bred with a round, short, compact body shape suffer. The long digestive tract of a rabbit is squashed and this causes digestive disorders. Rabbits require treatment from trained "Exotic" vets who are very expensive.

Teddy Bear/Miniature Rabbits are in fact - just Dwarf Rabbits that can be adopted at shelters and at every rabbit rescue across the states.

Rabbit Rescues are overwhelmed and over capacity with dumped and neglected rabbits. Shelters are full of unwanted pet rabbits and are euthanizing. People decide they don't want them anymore so many are just "dumped" outside to fend on their own, which they can't do, as they were not born in the wild. They now breed, get run over by cars, and are prey to other species.

In honor of Funny Biz' who died maliciously and cruelly, a vigil was held for him and all the animal victims.


